WHY SOIL HEALTH?

Whether you drive a tractor, ride a horse, or a hunting UTV your success depends on the ability of your soil to produce the commodity or experience that you desire. Join us at the Texas Soil Health Short Course in Victoria to learn about soil management strategies from farmers, ranchers and researchers across the country on methods to improve the health of your soil . This will be an educational experience that will give you new insight about your own operation.

5 Functions of Healthy Soil

1. Regulate water through available water holding capacity, porosity, and infiltration
2. Provide plants and animals a functioning habitat
3. Filter pollutants through biological and chemical processes
4. Cycle nutrients using carbon: nitrogen ratios and a biological predator /prey relationship
5. Provide stability and strength for greater resilience to adverse weather conditions.

- Water quality/quantity concerns?
- Dissatisfied with part of your operation?
- Interested in trying something new?
